

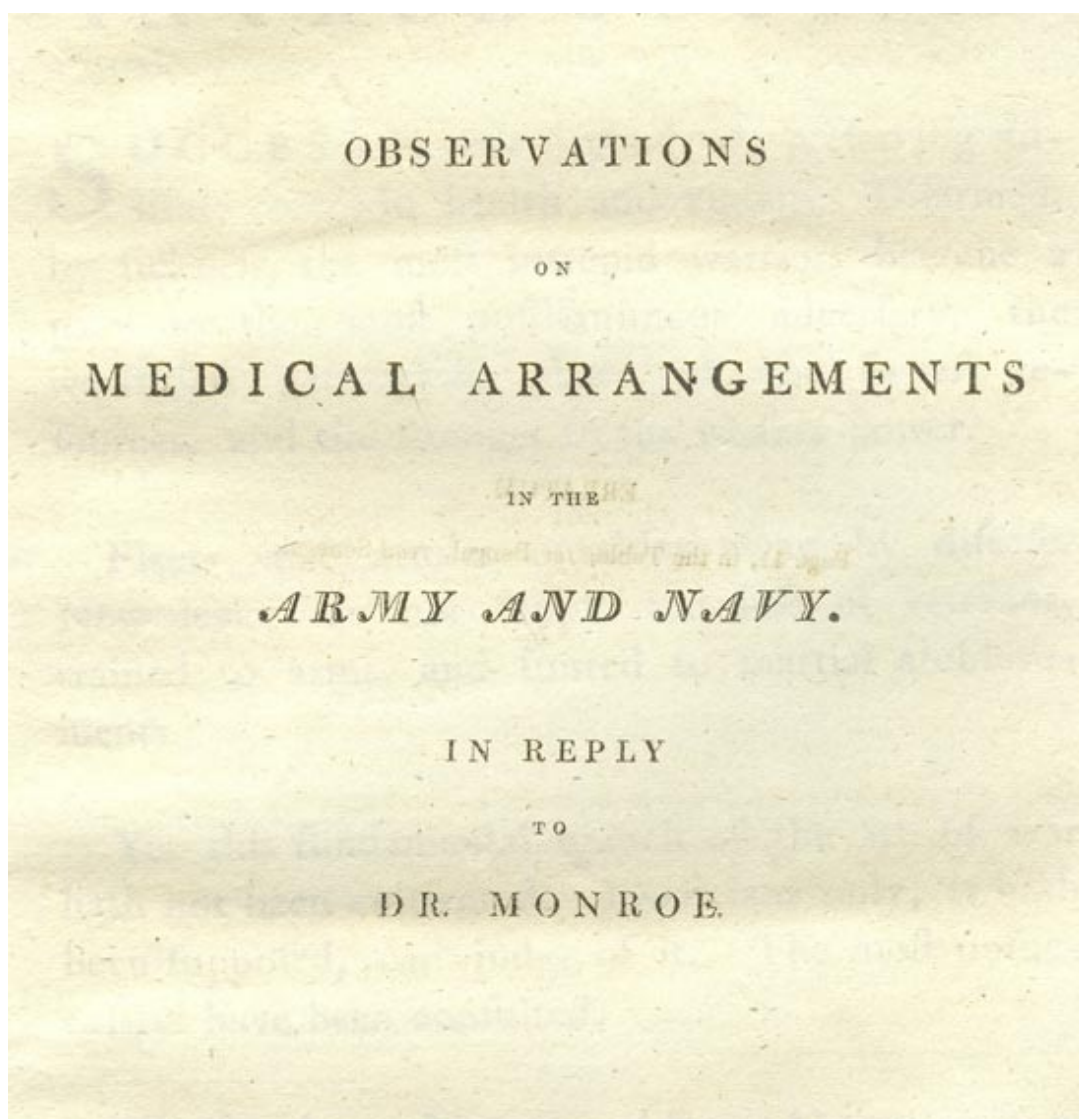

One hundred and seventy-seven were ill, None Died. <i>h</i>
His Majesty's Ship Juno, in America. Early and liberal use of Bark, without regarding remissions. One in Two Hundred and Sixteen Died. <i>i</i>	Juno, in America. Cordial Regimen, without Bark. One in Forty-nine Died. <i>k</i>	New York Hospital. By the use of camphor. One in seven Died. <i>l</i>	Gibraltar Hospital. Antimonials, camphor and nitre. Among the English, One in Ten, Among the Spanish prisoners, One in Thirteen Died. <i>m</i> .
